



Biogen Foundation Selects Grantees to Receive \$10 Million Investment for STEM Education

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., June 18, 2018 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- The [Biogen](#) Foundation today announced the six nonprofits that will share a previously-announced four-year, \$10 million grant to drive the development of local STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) education ecosystems in Cambridge and Somerville.

The Biogen Foundation's STAR Initiative is intended to strengthen and support educational offerings in these cities by helping increase access to STEM resources and opportunities for students currently underrepresented in STEM college or career pathways. STAR stands for Science, Teacher support, Access and Resources. Through a coordinated network of grantees, STAR endeavors to help low-income students develop and sustain their interest in STEM, gain necessary STEM exposure and enrichment opportunities, and successfully transition into post-secondary education in pursuit of STEM careers.

The six nonprofits selected by the Biogen Foundation will partner with Cambridge and Somerville public schools, focusing on students in grades 6-12. The nonprofits are: Breakthrough Greater Boston, Citizen Schools, Enroot, Lesley University, uAspire, and Young People's Project. These organizations will provide in or out-of-school STEM awareness, exploration, and skill-building supports and activities.

"Cambridge is the innovation and biotech capital of the world. With the STAR Initiative grant from the Biogen Foundation, and the exemplary recipient organizations they've selected, Biogen has also proven themselves to be an inspired leader in corporate citizenship," said Cambridge Mayor Marc C. McGovern. "I look forward to the robust learning experiences and the unique opportunities this will create for our youth in the ever-expanding local STEM job market."

The six organizations underwent an intensive application and interview process, and had to submit recommendations from school departments. They were ultimately chosen based on an alignment with Biogen Foundation's philanthropic vision, an ability to work with the schools, as well as together as a unit.

"We are honored to serve as a catalyst for collaboration among these six community partners to help students and teachers participate in the local STEM ecosystem," said Biogen Chief Executive Officer Michel Vounatsos. "Biogen is proud to demonstrate our continued commitment to education in our community through this important Biogen Foundation initiative."

The selected organizations will become part of a coordinated provider network managed by the Biogen Foundation. The STAR Initiative is intended to complement, supplement, and strengthen existing STEM education landscapes in Cambridge and Somerville.
